Refer to the schedule below to determine the times your child should attend their evaluation for their division (Squirt, Pee wee or Bantam) according to their last name.

Each Squirt, Pee wee and Bantam player is invited to attend both evaluations (i.e. March 14 and March 21). It is not mandatory to attend both sessions; however, we recommend you attend both to achieve your highest score in each skill area.

Players must arrive 30 minutes prior to their evaluation time to warm up and stretch. Players are to wear appropriate clothing (including indoor shoes and shorts), and bring ball equipment (gloves, bats, helmets, water bottle, etc.). Limited equipment will be available for those that don't have their own.

What to Expect at Player Evaluation:

At each session, players will be expected to participate in a number of drills that will evaluate the following skill areas:

- ✓ Fielding/Throwing
- ✓ Agility/Speed
- ✓ Hitting/Contact

All players in each division will participate in identical drills. Each player will be evaluated against objective criteria. Skills of each player will be assessed against established criteria, and recorded on the player's scorecard.

If a player chooses to participate in a 2nd evaluation, the higher of their scores in each skill area will be used to rank the player.

Player "ranking" is confidential and for the purposes of team placements (A, B or C team).

Players who choose to attend only one evaluation session will be assessed based on their scores for that day only. There will not be a 3rd evaluation session.

Injured players must attend a minimum of one evaluation session. They are expected to participate as much as they are able.

Players who do not attend either evaluation will be placed at the bottom of the division ranking. They will not be considered for "A" teams.

Players cannot attend another division's evaluation. For example, a Bantam-aged player cannot attend a Pee wee evaluation.

Pitcher/Catcher Evaluations

Players that wish to evaluate as a Squirt pitcher, or a pitcher or catcher in Pee wee and Bantam will be asked to identify themselves at the beginning of the evaluation so that they can be evaluated as such. Players interested in pitching or catching will be evaluated both as a pitcher/catcher AND as a player, and will receive two separate scores. Evaluating as a pitcher or catcher will in no way hinder that player's opportunity to play on an A team, if they rank high enough in their player score.

However for Squirt A, Pee wee A and Bantam A only the top selected pitchers will be allowed to pitch. It is also likely that only the top two catchers will catch regularly. Pitchers/catchers invited to join the A team as a player, but ranked below these cut offs, may choose to move to the B team if they want to pitch, or if they want to catch regularly.

What to expect after Player Evaluation:

Following the evaluation process, all players will be ranked according to their highest scores in each skill area.

Team placements (A, B or C team) are made based on the summary scores. Division Coordinators and/or Coaches will contact players and advise regarding team placement. Coaches will follow up with each of their players after team placements are made.
